The DCT, in consultation with relevant faculty as appropriate, will make a recommendation to the Director of Graduate Studies (DGS) to accept or not to accept each petitioned course and, if applicable, the M.A. thesis for transfer. Coursework and, if applicable, the M.A. thesis that is approved by the DGS may then be submitted to the Graduate College for final approval. The number of years to complete the program may be reduced due to the transfer of prior graduate coursework and/or the M.A. thesis by up to a maximum of 1 year.

However, students are guaranteed 5 years of funding, regardless of the amount of prior graduate coursework, and most students who receive transfer credit nonetheless choose to stay for the full 5 years to provide them with ample opportunity to increase their research publications and thus increase their competitiveness for research postdoctoral fellowships or the academic job market upon graduation, and also to accrue sufficient practicum hours to be competitive for the clinical-internship match process. Students who enter the program with prior graduate work in psychology may petition for transfer credit for this work.

Those who have completed a master's degree in psychology may petition to transfer up to 24 credit hours, including the M.A. thesis; otherwise, the transfer limit is 9 credit hours. To petition for transfer credit, students first must submit to the Director of Clinical Training (DCT) their graduate transcript(s), and the syllabi, including reading lists, for all courses for which they are petitioning to transfer credit, indicating which clinical-area course requirement each previously completed course would fulfill. To petition for transfer credit for the M.A. thesis, the student must submit a copy of the thesis to the DCT. Prior to submitting a petition for transfer credit, students are encouraged to work with their research advisor and/or the DCT to determine the best "match" between their prior graduate coursework and the clinical-area course requirements. For all materials, electronic copies are preferred.
